Special Educational Needs in England: January 2002



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**SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS IN ENGLAND:
JANUARY 2002**

Introduction

1 This bulletin summarises the information available on Special Educational Needs (SEN) and related information about special schools in England. It updates the information contained in the Statistical Bulletin "Special Educational Needs in England: January 2001", issue number 12/01, published in November 2001. It also revises the provisional 2002 figures published in the Statistical First Release (SFR) "Special Educational Needs in Schools in England, January 2002".

2 Arrangements for identifying and providing for children with SEN are set out in Part IV of the 1996 act (and, prior to this, the 1981 and 1993 Education Acts). New rights and duties have been introduced by the SEN and Disability Act 2001 (SENDA). A Code of Practice, issued in 1994, supported the rights and duties in the 1996 Act. A new SEN Code of Practice replaced this in January 2002. All LEAs, schools and early years settings must have regard to it.

3 The new Code replaces the five stages with School/Early Years Action, School/Early Years Action Plus and Statements of SEN. For PLASC 2002, both old and new systems were allowable. The effect of this change has been to reduce the number of pupils recorded as having SEN without statements. The data on SEN pupils without statements shown in **Table 1b** is not therefore directly comparable with those for earlier years.

4 Information is mainly drawn from two sources: the Annual Schools' Census (formerly Form 7) and the SEN2 survey (titled 'Education Act 1996: Return of information on children with statements of special educational needs'). The figures from these two sources should not be aggregated or compared.

5 The Annual Schools' Census has collected information on pupils with SEN on the census date in January from schools since 1985. It is completed by schools and records those pupils with and without statements who are educated at the school, regardless of which LEA is responsible. Figures for non-statemented SEN pupils were collected from maintained primary and secondary schools for the first time in 1995.

6 In January 2002 the Annual Schools' Census (ASC) introduced a major change in that maintained primary, secondary and special schools reported data at an individual pupil level for the first time. Whilst the overall collection of the Pupil Level Annual Schools' Census for these schools was successful, **it is possible that some discontinuity in the time series data has resulted from this underlying change in data collection.** It is noticeable for instance that the national trend in SEN pupils with statements between 2001 and 2002 in ASC is different from that shown in the SEN2 survey. Whilst there are valid reasons as to why the figures will be different between these surveys, it is unusual for the trends to differ to this degree.

7 The SEN2 survey has collected information on children with statements on the census date in January and new statements made in the previous calendar year from LEAs since 1984. SEN2 is completed by LEAs and records those children for whom the LEA is responsible (regardless of whether they are educated in the LEA's own maintained schools, in other LEAs' schools, in the non-maintained or independent sectors).

8 The Pupils Registration (Amendment) Regulations 1994 allow pupils to be dually registered at a mainstream primary or secondary school, a special school or Pupil Referral Unit (PRU). Dually registered pupils in special schools and PRUs are excluded from some of the tables to avoid double counting.

SEN STATISTICS AND TRENDS

Incidence and placement of pupils with SEN

The trend information presented here needs to be viewed with some caution because of the changes in data collection in 2002 (see paragraph 6 above).

9 **Table 1a** shows that in 2002, some 249,000 pupils in all schools in England had statements of SEN. This represents an decrease of 3.6 per cent since 2001; but an increase of 6.1 per cent over the five year period since 1997.

10 The percentage of pupils with statements placed in maintained primary and secondary schools in 2002 was 60 per cent (149,900), a decrease from 61 per cent (158,000) in 2001 and an increase from 57 per cent (134,100) in 1997. Over the five year period, there has been a corresponding decrease in the percentage of pupils with statements placed in special schools (maintained and non-maintained) or PRUs, from 40 per cent in 1997 to 37 per cent in 2002. Over this period the total number of pupils in special schools (excluding PRUs), including both pupils with and without statements, has fallen from 95,600 to 94,500 (Table 13).

11 The Education Act 1996 and its predecessors put a general duty on LEAs to secure education of children with statements in mainstream schools provided that this is in line with the parents' wishes, is suitable for the child's SEN and does not hinder the education of other children and represents an efficient use of resources. The Special Educational Needs and Disability Act 2001 strengthens the right for children with SEN to be educated in mainstream school.

12 **Table 1b** shows the time series since 1997 of SEN pupils without statements. In 2002 there were some 1,400,000 pupils with SEN but without statements, representing 16.9 per cent of pupils on roll. Contrary to the pattern for statemented pupils, the incidence of non-statemented pupils with SEN is greater in primary schools (19.1 per cent) than in secondary schools (15.9 per cent of pupils). Because of changes in the classification system for SEN, the number of SEN pupils

without statements in 2002 are not directly comparable with the figures for earlier years.

13 Table 2 shows a time series from 1997 to 2002 of the number and percentage of pupils with statements of SEN in schools in each Local Education Authority area and Government Office Region. There are wide variations within and between regions. For any particular LEA area, the number and percentage of pupils with statements of SEN in schools may include those pupils placed by other LEAs and exclude those pupils with statements placed by the LEA in other LEA areas. Table 2 may therefore not fully reflect an LEA's policy and arrangements.

14 Table 3 gives a breakdown of the numbers and percentages of pupils with statements, and those with identified SEN but without statements, in primary and secondary schools separately for each Local Education Authority area and Government Office Region. Information on the number of SEN pupils without statements was collected from maintained primary and secondary schools for the first time in 1995, and from independent schools for the first time in 1996. All pupils in special schools have SEN.

15 On average 2.4 per cent of pupils at secondary schools had statements of SEN compared to 1.6 per cent of pupils at primary schools. The regions with the lowest percentage of statemented pupils in primary schools were the West Midlands and East of England regions with South West region having the highest, whilst in secondary schools the regions with the lowest percentage were the East of England and South East regions with Inner London having the highest percentage. Primary schools had a higher proportion of pupils with SEN but without statements than secondary schools, at 19.1 per cent and 15.9 per cent respectively.

Distribution of Pupils with SEN across Primary and Secondary Schools

16 Table 4 shows the numbers of primary and secondary schools by percentage of pupils with statements. Some 71 per cent of primary schools had less than 2 per cent of pupils with statements compared to 43 per cent for secondary schools.

17 Table 5 shows the equivalent figures for all pupils identified as having SEN, including those pupils without statements. There is greater similarity in the distribution of schools between primary and secondary in this case than is the case for pupils with statements. For instance 40 per cent of both primary and secondary schools had between 10 per cent and 20 per cent of pupils with SEN.

18 Tables 6 and 7 show, nationally and by Government Office Region and Local Education Authority area, numbers of schools analysed by percentage of pupils

with statements. **Table 6** shows that over 70 per cent of primary schools had less than 2 per cent of pupils with statements of SEN and less than 1 per cent had over 10 per cent of pupils with statements. **Table 7** shows that 3 per cent of secondary schools had no pupils with statements of SEN; and 1 per cent had 8 or more per cent of pupils with statements. In both **Table 6** and **Table 7** the pattern of course varies by region and LEA, though in the case of the LEA figures, small numbers of schools can distort the picture.

All children with statements of SEN

19 Figures for the total number of children with statements (not just those in schools) by age in England, 2002, are shown in **Table 8**. Around 264,900 children had statements in January 2002. Of these, 138,700 (52 per cent) were aged 11-15 years and 99,200 (37 per cent) were aged 5-10 years.

20 Table 9 shows a time series from January 1997 to 2002 of the number of children for whom each LEA maintained a statement. The number of children with statements continued to rise to 264,900, in 2002, an increase of 0.2 per cent from 264,300 in 2001 and 11 per cent higher than 238,600 in 1997. There were wide variations within and between regions.

21 Figures in **Table 8** differ from those in **Table 2** in the following ways:

- a** Table 8 includes but Table 2 excludes pupils with statements maintained by the LEA but placed in schools outside the LEA area;
- b** Table 2 includes but Table 8 excludes pupils educated in the LEA area but whose statements are maintained by another LEA;
- c** Table 8 additionally includes children with statements educated other than at school.

Newly made statements of SEN

22 Table 8 shows figures on the assessment and placement of children with new statements in 2001. Of the 34,000 children assessed for SEN during the 2001 calendar year, 32,500 (96 per cent) were issued with a statement for the first time. Of these, 8 per cent were placed in units attached to maintained mainstream schools, 69 per cent were placed in maintained mainstream schools, 18 per cent in special schools (maintained and non-maintained), 2 per cent in independent schools and 3 per cent in other schools and under other arrangements. 52 per cent of children with new statements were aged 5-10 and 26 per cent were aged 11-15.

23 Relatively few pupils with statements transferred between mainstream and special schools in 2001; around 5,300 pupils transferred from mainstream to special or independent schools, and around 1,100 from special or independent to mainstream schools. During

the year, statements were discontinued for around 8,900 children below statutory school leaving age.

24 Table 10 shows the assessment and placement of children with new statements for each LEA area.

25 Table 11 shows a time series for the percentage of pupils with statements made for the first time placed in units attached to mainstream schools and maintained mainstream schools, by LEA in calendar years 1999 to 2001. For some LEAs, numbers of new statements each year are small. As individual children's special educational needs vary greatly, caution should be exercised in drawing year on year comparisons on where they were placed. However, over this period there is much variation between the percentages for individual LEAs.

26 Table 12 shows a time series of the assessment and placement of children with new statements for the calendar years 1996 to 2001. The number of children for whom a statement was made for the first time decreased between 1996 and 1997 from 36,600 to 35,600, and has since fallen to 32,500 in 2001. The percentage of children with new statements placed in mainstream schools and units attached to mainstream schools has risen every year, from 69.5 per cent in 1996 to 76.3 per cent in 2001. The percentage in special schools (maintained and non-maintained) fell from 23 per cent in 1996 to 18.2 per cent in 2000, and then to 18.1 per cent in 2001.

Special Schools: Schools, pupils and staff

27 Table 13 shows a time series (1997-2002) of the numbers of maintained and non-maintained special schools and numbers of staff and pupils in them.

28 The number of maintained special schools continued to fall, down 6 per cent from 1,171 in 1997 to 1,098 in 2002. There were 89,797 pupils (full and part-time) in maintained special schools in 2002, down slightly from 90,963 in 2000. The average size of maintained special schools remained at 81 in 2002, up from 78 in 1997.

29 The number of non-maintained special schools increased by 1 between 2001 and 2002 but there was an overall decrease from 68 in 1997. The total number of pupils (full and part-time) in non-maintained special schools, although up slightly compared with 2001, fell 11 per cent, from 5,231 in 1997 to 4,670 in 2002.

30 The number of teachers (qualified and non-qualified) in maintained special schools continued to fall and is down 3 per cent from 14,100 to 13,700 between 1997 and 2002. The pupil:teacher ratio decreased slightly from 6.6 in 2001 to 6.5 in 2002. The number of education support staff continued to increase, up 13 per cent from 16,300 in 2001 to 18,400 in 2002. The number of administrative and clerical staff rose by 9 per cent from 2,000 in 2001 to 2,200 in 2002.

31 The number of teachers (qualified and non-qualified) in non-maintained special schools fell slightly compared with 2001 and is down 17 per cent from 1,200 in 1997 to 1,000 in 2002. The pupil:teacher ratio remained the same as 2001 at 4.8. The number of education support staff increased to 3,400 in 2002. Administrative and clerical staff numbers decreased to 266.

32 Table 14 shows the percentage of pupils attending maintained and non-maintained special schools in each Local Education Authority area and Government Office Region, in 1997 and 2002. For any particular LEA, this may include those pupils placed by other LEAs and exclude those pupils placed by the LEA in other LEA's schools.

33 In 2002, around 1.1 per cent of pupils attended special schools in England, the same as the previous year.

KEY FACTS

- **Figure 1** shows that 249,000 pupils or 3 per cent of all pupils in schools had statements of SEN in 2002.
- The number of pupils with statements decreased from an estimated 258,000 in 2001 to 249,000 in 2002. The percentage of pupils who had statements of SEN decreased slightly from an estimated 3.1 per cent in 2000 to 3.0 per cent in 2001.
- **Figure 2** shows that in 2002, 60 per cent of pupils with statements were placed in maintained mainstream schools (nursery, primary and secondary), 37 per cent in either special schools (maintained and non-maintained) or Pupil Referral Units (PRUs) and 3 per cent in independent schools.
- The percentage of pupils with statements placed in maintained mainstream schools continued to increase, from 57 per cent in 1997 to 60 per cent in 2002. The percentage placed in special schools (maintained and non-maintained) or PRUs fell from 40 per cent in 1997 to 37 per cent in 2002.
- Of the children for whom a statement was made for the first time in 2001, 32,500 were receiving the provision specified in their statement and of these 76 per cent were placed in mainstream schools.

- Between 1997 and 2002, the total number of pupils in maintained or non-maintained special schools, including those with and without statements, fell from 98,200 to 94,500.

- Including those pupils with statements, primary schools had, on average, a slightly higher proportion of pupils with SEN (20.7 per cent) than secondary schools (18.3 per cent). A small number of these schools identify more than half of their pupils as having SEN.

Pupils with SEN statements as a percentage of all pupils, England 1997-2002

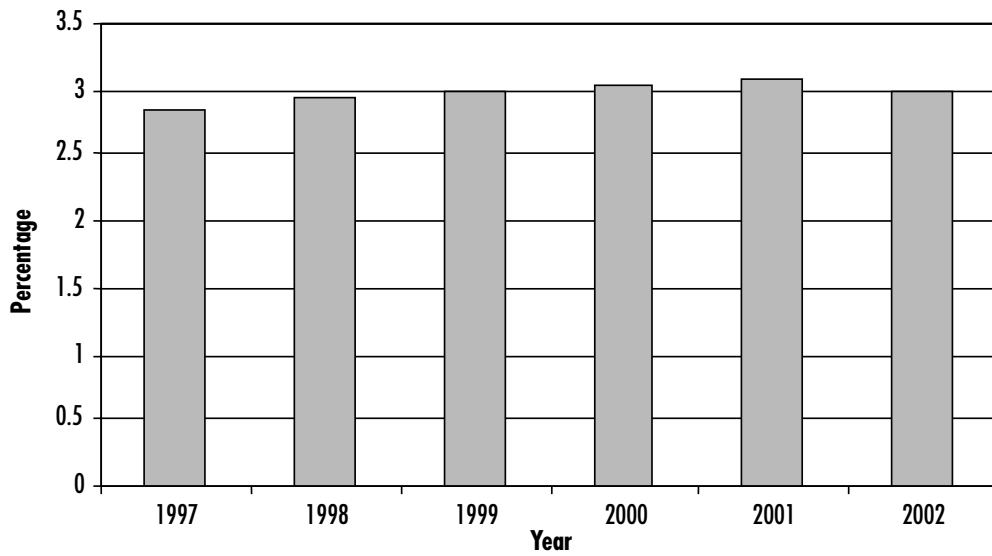
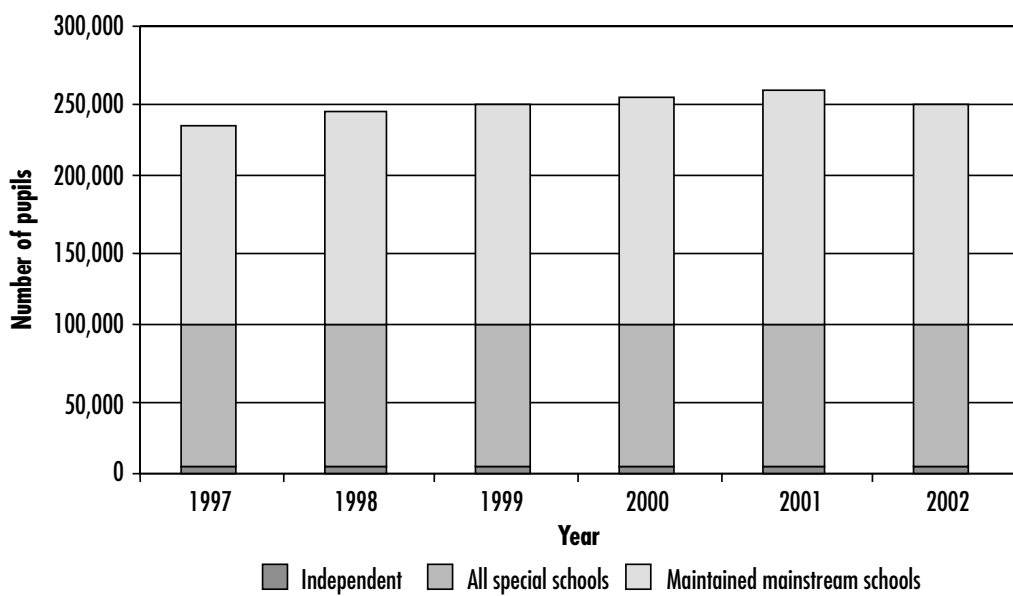
